STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Amend the Law Regarding Shoplifters.

1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

17 MRSA §3521, as enacted by PL 1975, c. 543, is amended to read:

§3521. Detention of shoplifters

A store owner, manager or supervisor, or that person's designee, may detain on the premises in a reasonable manner and 9 for a period of time not to exceed 1/2 hour any person he-has for 11 whom there is probable cause to believe is unlawfully concealing merchandise. The purposes of such detention shall be: To require 13 the person being detained to identify---himself provide identification; to verify such the identification; to inform a law enforcement officer of the detention and to surrender such 15 that person to said the officer; and when the detained person is 17 a minor, to inform a law enforcement officer or the parents or guardian of said the minor of the detention and to surrender him 19 the minor to the person so informed.

Any sheriff, deputy sheriff, municipal or state police officer, if he <u>the officer</u> has probable cause to believe that a
person has unlawfully concealed merchandise, may arrest such <u>that</u> person without a warrant, whether or not such <u>the</u> concealment was
committed in his <u>the officer's</u> presence.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides that a store owner, manager or 31 supervisor, or that person's designee, may detain a person suspected of shoplifting on the premises in a reasonable manner 33 for up to 30 minutes.
