An Act to Change the Dates for Burial Eligibility at the Maine Veterans' Memorial Cemetery.



Т	be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

21	United States Armed Forces in Vietnam, December 22, 1961 to August 5, 1964 or was eligible for an

25	(i) If discharged, received an honorable
27	discharge or a general discharge under honorable conditions, provided that the
29	discharge was not upgraded through a program of general amnesty; and
