STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act Relating to the Dig-safe Law.

1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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23 MRSA §3360-A, sub-§9, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 362, §2, is amended to read:

A. Nothing in this section shall-apply applies to the Department of Transportation, a public utility, municipal public works department or sewer district, if written or verbal notice of the approximate location and time of that excavation is given by that utility, department or district to a designated representative of those other utilities, districts, municipal sewer or public works departments prior to any excavation taking place.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Prior to the passage of Public Law 1985, chapter 111, sections 1 and 2, the Department of Transportation was exempt
from the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 23, section 3360-A for highway construction and maintenance activities on state and
state aid highways. In 1985, this exemption was removed with the exception of the installation and maintenance of highway signs.

Many public utilities which maintain underground facilities have joined a network known as Operation Dig Safe, which provides 27 a toll free number for use by municipal public works departments and other public utilities whenever they excavate. Use of this 29 network is provided by Title 23, section 3360-A, subsection 9, 31 paragraph A, which permits public utilities and municipal public works departments to notify the affected owner of the underground Due to 33 facility by either written or verbal notice. anoversight, when the Department of Transportation's exemption was removed in 1985, the department was not added to Title 23, 35 section 3360-A, subsection 9, paragraph A. This bill corrects 37 that oversight by adding the Department of Transportation to permit the department to participate in the Operation Dig Safe 39 program.

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
