An Act to Enhance Enforcement of Municipal Parking Regulations.

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39		STATEMENT OF FACT
41	This bill increases the ability of a municipality to obtain compliance with its parking regulations by facilitating	
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47	difficult to enforce.	

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In this bill, a municipality may enact an ordinance establishing a system for providing notice and opportunity to be heard to the owners of illegally parked vehicles and failure to pay adjudicated tickets or court fines may affect the registration.

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
