IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Require the Use of Flashing Amber Lights on Vehicles During Sanding and Snow Removal Operations.

1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

29 MRSA §1462, as amended by PL 1971, c. 360, §§41 and 42, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

<u>§1462. Snow removal or sanding equipment</u>

1. Amber lights required on vehicles. All vehicles, while being used for the express purpose of plowing snow or sanding on 9 public ways shall be equipped with at least 2 auxiliary lights to be mounted on the highest practical point on the vehicle, one 11 showing to the front and one to the rear of the vehicle. The 13 lights shall emit an amber beam of light and shall be at least 6 inches in diameter and shall be equipped with blinker attachments. In lieu of the lights specified, vehicles may be 15 equipped with at least one auxiliary rotary flashing light having 4-inch sealed beams and showing amber beams of light over a 360° 17 range. When the left wing of the plow is in operation and 19 extends over the center of the road, an auxiliary light shall show the extreme end of the left wing. This light may be attached to the vehicle with the beam of light pointed at the 21 left wing. These lights may be controlled by a separate switch 23 or may be controlled by the regular lighting system and shall be in operation whenever the vehicles are used for plowing snow and sanding on public ways in either the nighttime or daytime. The 25 use of these auxiliary lights shall not relieve the owner or operator from conforming to section 1366. 27

 29 2. Display required during operations. Any vehicle, while engaged in snow removal or sanding operations on a public way,
 31 shall display the flashing or rotating amber lights required by subsection 1 or authorized by section 1367-B, subsection 5.

STATEMENT OF FACT

37 Present law requires that vehicles plowing snow or sanding be equipped with flashing or rotating amber lights. This bill
39 makes it clear that those lights must be turned on during sanding or snow removal operations on public ways.
