STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Further Define the Responsibilities of the Maine Milk Commission to Ensure a Supply of Milk to the Consumers of Maine.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

7 MRSA §2953, first ¶, as repealed and replaced by PL 1975, c. 517, §2, is amended to read:

The commission shall have power to establish and change the minimum wholesale and retail prices for the sale of milk within the State, in such a manner as to supplement such the supervision and regulations as are now imposed by existing statutes laws or by lawful ordinances or rules and regulations of the several cities and towns of the State. The commission shall have no power to modify, add to or annual annul any sanitary regulations imposed by any state or municipal authority or to compel pasturization in any market area. The commission shall ensure that distributors make regular deliveries of milk in all parts of the State to retail outlets, schools, hospitals, nursing homes and restaurants requesting deliveries.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The bill requires distributors to deliver milk to convenience stores and other small outlets requesting deliveries.
