IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Recognize Outstanding Local Commitment to Education.

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA \$15607, sub-\$11, as amended by PL 1987, c. 850, \$2 and 5, is further amended to read:

25 27	<b>11. Recognition grants.</b> The following provisions apply to recognition grants.
29 31	A. A grant of \$100 per pupil shall be paid to each school administrative unit for each grant year in which:
33	(1) The unit's resident per pupil operating cost figure exceeds the statewide average of resident per pupil operating cost figures by at least 10%; and
37	(2) The unit's per pupil state subsidy to be paid in the grant year to the school administrative unit is at least 20% below the state average per pupil subsidy.
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41	<u>B. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.</u>
43	(1) "Grant year" means the year over which the grant
45	will be paid to a school administrative unit, which shall begin on July 1st and end June 30th.
47	(2) "Per pupil state reimbursement" means the state
49	<u>subsidy to be paid to the school administrative unit in</u> the grant year, divided by the average number of
51	resident pupils for which the unit was financially responsible on October 1st and April 1st of the school year 2 years prior to the grant year.

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	(3) "Resident per pupil operating cost figure" means
3	the sum of the actual local operating costs for the
	base year as described in section 15603, subsection 2,
5	and the actual local program costs for the base year as
	described in section 15603, subsection 4, paragraphs A
7	and B, divided by the average number of resident pupils
	for which the unit was financially responsible on
9	October 1st and April 1st of the school year 2 years
	<u>prior to the grant year.</u>
