An Act to Amend the Truck Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

5	(4) A stinger-steered autotransporter may be operated on the Interstate Highway System and those qualifying
7	federal aid primary system highways designated by the Secretary of the United States Department of
9	Transportation pursuant to the United States Surface Transportation Assistance Act of 1982, Public Law
11	97-424, Section 411, with an overall length not to exceed 75 feet.
13	Notwithstanding any other provision of the law, combination vehicles designed for the transportation of
15	automobiles shall be permitted a front overhang of not more than 3 feet and a rear overhang of not more than 4
17	feet. These overhangs shall be in addition to the length limits authorized in this section.

35	qualifying federal aid primary system highways, as designated by the Secretary of the United States Department
37	of Transportation, and terminals, facilities for food, fuel, repairs and rest and points of loading and unloading for

41	Any permits required pursuant to this paragraph shall be issued by the Secretary of State with the advice and consent
43	of the Commissioner of Transportation.

47	STATEMENT OF FACT
49	This bill conforms Maine law to federal requirements by permitting combinations consisting of a truck tractor and 2
51	semitrailers to operate on the Interstate Highway System. The

bill also corrects a technical error created by the enactment of 2 public laws amending the same section.
