An Act to Remove the Provision that Persons Doing Electrical Work on Generating Facilities Need Not be Licensed.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

32 MRSA §1102, sub-§§1 and 2, as repealed and replaced by PL 1973, c. 363, are amended to read:

1. Commissions. Any person, firm or corporation under jurisdiction of the Public Utilities Commission of this State, or the Federal Communications Commission or the Interstate Commerce Commission, <u>excepting electric generating facilities</u>, or any employee of such person, firm or corporation for the purpose of making electrical installations in the course of such employment;

 Utility corporations. Regular employees of utility corporations, <u>excepting electric generating facilities</u>,
performing electrical work in connection with the construction, installation, operation, repair or maintenance of any utility by
a utility corporation in rendering its authorized service, or in any way incidental thereto;

STATEMENT OF FACT

Currently, electric work on public utilities and facilities under the jurisdiction of the Public Utilities Commission, Federal Communications Commission or Interstate Commerce Commission may be performed by persons who are not licensed electricians.

This bill requires that persons performing electrical work 31 on electric generating facilities must be licensed electricians.
