IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Discourage the Theft of Blueberries.

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §4302, sub-§§1-B, 1-C, 1-D, 1-E and 5 are enacted to read:

7	<u>1-B. Crew leader. "Crew leader" means a person designated</u> by an owner to supervise an organized crew.
9	1-C. Organized crew. "Organized crew" means a group of people working together under the supervision of a crew leader
11	to harvest, pick, rake, possess or remove blueberries from the land of an owner.
13	1 D. Gran "Gran" includes a lendermen en leaseholden of
15	1-D. Owner. "Owner" includes a landowner or leaseholder of land on which blueberries are grown and harvested for profit, or the landowner's or leaseholder's outborized areast and includes a
17	<u>the landowner's or leaseholder's authorized agent, and includes a</u> receiver of blueberries grown in Canada and purchased from
	Canadian sellers.

21	1-E. Permanent record. "Permanent record" means a written record which is kept and maintained for not less than 6 years.
23	5. Transportation permit. "Transportation permit" means an official permit on forms duly adopted and furnished by the Maine
25	Blueberry Commission to owners.
27	Sec. 2. 36 MRSA §§4314 to 4317 are enacted to read:
29	<u>§4314. Permit required</u>
31	 Possession or removal unlawful. It shall be unlawful
33	for any person to harvest, pick, rake, possess or remove blueberries from the land of an owner without first securing
35	written permission from the owner or the owner's authorized agent. This section shall not apply to members of an organized
37	<u>crew, provided the crew leader has first secured the written</u> <u>permission of the owner. Any person authorized to make</u>
39	inspections under this chapter may require any person on the land of an owner who has possession of blueberries or is found harvesting, raking, picking or removing blueberries to show a
41	current written permit.
43	2. Limitations. No permit is required under this section when the person on the land of an owner has possession of not
45	more than 5 pounds of blueberries.
47	3. No effect on other laws. Nothing in this section may be construed:
49	A. To relieve any person of any obligation to obtain
51	permission to enter upon the land or premises of another; or

5	<u>4. Violation. Any violation of this section is a Class E</u> crime.
7	§4315. Transportation of blueberries
0	1 Transportation of bluebouries without servit It is
9	<u>1. Transportation of blueberries without permit. It is unlawful for any person to transport blueberries in quantities</u>
11	exceeding 5 pounds without first obtaining a transportation
13	permit on an official form to be furnished by the Maine Blueberry Commission. The Maine Blueberry Commission shall issue official transportation permit forms to owners who may issue the
15	transportation permits to individuals. Each permit issued shall
	bear a different number and shall expire at the end of the
17	<u>calendar year. When an owner issues a transportation permit, the</u> <u>owner shall immediately send a copy to the Maine Blueberry</u>
19	Commission. The commission shall keep a permanent record of all
21	permits issued. The commission may promulgate rules establishing the form and content of transportation permits and governing the means of their issuance and establishing the record-keeping
23	functions of the commission and the owners.
25	2. Permits subject to forgery laws. Every permit specified
	under this section is deemed to be a written instrument subject
27	to the laws of forgery.
29	3. Out-of-state delivery. No transportation permit is
31	<u>required of any person transporting blueberries harvested in</u> <u>Canada or in another state through this State if blueberries will</u>
31	not be delivered to any person within this State.

35	4. Proof of ownership or lawful custody. Nothing in this section may apply to persons transporting blueberries when that
55	person can procure a bill of sale, sales receipt or other proof
37	of ownership or lawful custody of the blueberries.
39	5. Violation. Violation of this section is a Class D crime.
41	§4316. Receivers of blueberries
43	1. Record keeping required. Any person who receives
45	<u>blueberries must keep a permanent record of each lot or load of</u> <u>blueberries received. The record shall include the name of the</u>
- J J	driver of the vehicle used to deliver the blueberries, the date
47	of delivery, the delivery point, the number of the transportation
40	permit, the driver's license number and the total pounds of
49	<u>blueberries</u> delivered.
51	2. Inspection of permit required. It shall be unlawful for any person to receive or accept delivery of any blueberries in

- lots of greater than 5 pounds without first inspecting the transportation permit of the driver of the vehicle used to
 deliver the blueberries and recording the transportation permit number in accordance with subsection 1 of this section.
 - <u>3. Violations. Any violation of this section shall constitute a Class D crime.</u>
- q i 4. Audits. The Maine Blueberry Commission may request the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources to conduct, through its staff, audits of the records kept pursuant to this 11 section for the purpose of ascertaining compliance with this 13 section. Any documents inspected or taken by the department in furtherance of the audit functions or any other information 15 collected by the department pursuant to the audits shall be kept confidential notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained 17 in Title 1, chapter 13, subchapter I. The confidential status shall not apply to any documents, records or information which 19 become evidence in any criminal proceeding to enforce any law under this chapter or any other criminal law. 21
 - <u>§4317. Authorized law enforcement</u>

State police, county sheriffs and their deputies, municipal enforcement officers, state forest rangers and game wardens are authorized to make inspections, conduct investigations, make arrests and otherwise enforce this chapter.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to reduce the theft of 33 blueberries during harvest of the crop. This bill would make it a crime for any person to harvest, pick, rake, possess or remove 35 blueberries on the land of another without first securing written permission the owner the land or authorized of of 37 representative. It will also make it a crime to transport without a numbered permit blueberries formal, containing pertinent additional information. 39 Finally, this bill would make it a crime to receive blueberries without inspecting the transportation permit and recording pertinent information from 41 the permit to provide documentation as to the source of the 43 blueberries and the identity of the driver.

 Administration of this law will be the responsibility of the Maine Blueberry Commission, which may enlist the assistance of the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources for compliance efforts. Potentially sensitive business information
 which is subject to audit is afforded confidential status.
