STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act Concerning Teacher Employment.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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20-A MRSA §13201, first ¶, as amended by PL 1985, c. 797, §50, is further amended to read:

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The superintendent shall nominate all teachers for initial 7 employment, subject to such regulations governing salaries and the qualifications of teachers as the school board shall make. 9 Upon the approval of nominations, by the school board, the superintendent may employ teachers so nominated and approved for such terms as the superintendent may deem proper, subject to the 11 approval of the school board. No later than 3 months prior to 13 the expiration of a teacher's initial employment contract and no later than 6 months prior to the expiration of a teacher's 2nd 15 year's employment contract, the school board shall act on the renewal of the teacher's employment contract. Failure to act 17 timely by the school board shall result in the renewal of the contract for an additional year in the case of a first year 19 teacher or for an additional 2 years in the case of a 2nd year teacher. In case the superintendent of schools and the school 21 board fail to legally elect a teacher, the commissioner shall have the authority to appoint a substitute teacher who shall 23 serve until such election is made.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to require school boards to act on the renewal of a probationary teacher's employment contract.

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
