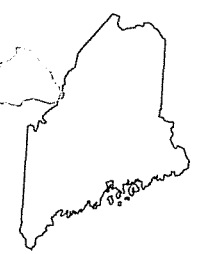

An Act to Amend the Lobbyist Reporting Law.

---



1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

3 3 MRSA §319, sub-§3, is enacted to read:

5 2. Exemption. Notwithstanding section 317, subsection 1, a  
7 registered lobbyist is exempt from the penalty imposed under this  
9 section if, while the Legislature is convened in special session,  
11 the lobbyist failed to file a report with the Secretary of State  
13 pursuant to section 317 provided that no lobbying has been  
15 performed during that special session.

13 STATEMENT OF FACT

15 This bill provides that, when the Legislature is in special  
17 session, registered lobbyists would not be required to pay fines  
19 for not reporting after the session if they had no activity  
during the special session.
