IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Clarify the Motor Vehicle Law Concerning the Operation of Motorcycles.

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	Sec. 1. 29 MRSA §999, 4th \P , as enacted by PL 1981, c. 88, §4, is amended to read:
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	The operator of a motorcycle or a motor driven cycle shall
7	not overtake and pass in the lane occupied by the vehicle being overtaken. This paragraph does not apply to a motorcyclist
9	passing a bicycle nor to a police officers officers in the
	performance of his <u>their</u> duties.
11	Sec. 2. 29 MRSA §999, as amended by PL 1981, c. 88, §4, is
13	further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:
15	An operator who fails to keep both of the motorcycle's wheels on the surface on which it is being operated is guilty of
17	driving to endanger under section 1314. This paragraph does not
	apply to police officers in the performance of their duties.

	STATEMENT OF FACT
23	
	This bill requires operators of motorcycles to keep both
25	wheels on the ground while operating the motorcycle. A person
	who violates this law is guilty of driving to endanger. This
27	bill does not apply to law enforcement officers.
