An Act to Reform the Maine Board of Professional Surveyors Law.

19	§13901. Definitions
21	As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
23	1. Board. "Board" means the Board of Licensure for
25	Professional Surveyors.
27	2. Commissioner. "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Professional and Financial Regulation.
29	3. Department. "Department" means the Department of
31	Professional and Financial Regulation.
33	4. Land surveyor. "Land surveyor" means any person who has been licensed as a land surveyor by the board.

37	5. Land surveyor-in-training. "Land surveyor-in-training" means any person who has been licensed as such by the board.
39	6. Practice of land surveying. "Practice of land surveying" means any service or work involving the application of
41	special knowledge of the principles of mathematics, the related physical and applied sciences and the relevant requirements of
43	law for measuring and locating lines, angles, elevations, natural
. ,	and man-made features in the air, on the surface of the earth,
45	within underground workings and on the beds of bodies of water. This shall be done for the purpose of determining areas and
47	volumes, for the monumenting of property boundaries and for the
49	platting and layout of lands and subdivisions of land, including topography, alignment and grades of streets and for the
	preparation and perpetuation of maps, record plats, field note
51	records and property descriptions that represent these surveys.

- A person shall be deemed to practice or offer to practice land surveying within the meaning and intent of this chapter if that

 person engages in land surveying or by verbal claim, sign, advertisement, letterhead, card or in any other way makes a representation that the person is a professional land surveyor or makes a representation that the person is able to perform or does perform any land surveying service or work or any other service designated by the practitioner which is recognized as land surveying.
 - 7. Responsible charge. "Responsible charge" means direct control and personal supervision of land surveying.

§13902. Board of Licensure for Professional Surveyors; establishment; compensation

- 1. Establishment and membership. As established in Title 5, section 12004-A, the Board of Licensure for Professional Surveyors shall exist within the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation. The board shall consist of 7 members appointed by the Governor, of which 5 shall be land surveyors and 2 shall be public members. Each member of the board must be a citizen of the United States and a resident of this State, and all land surveyor members must be licensed land surveyors and must have been licensed as a land surveyor for not less than 10 years. A public member may not be or have been a professional land surveyor.
- 2. Terms of appointment; removal. Appointments shall be for 5-year terms, except that no more than one land surveyor member's term may expire in any one calendar year and appointments for terms of less than 5 years may be made in order to comply with this limitation. No person may be eligible to serve more than 2 full consecutive terms, provided that for this purpose only a period actually served which exceeds 1/2 of the 5-year term shall be deemed a full term. Upon expiration of a member's term, the member shall serve until that member's successor is qualified and appointed. The successor's term shall be 5 years from the date of that expiration, regardless of the date of the appointment.
- The Governor may remove any member of the board for cause.

 43 Vacancies in the membership of the board shall be filled for the unexpired term by appointment by the Governor.
 - 3. Compensation. Members of the board shall be compensated as provided in Title 5, chapter 379.

 4. Meetings; officers; quorum; seal. The board shall meet at least once a year to conduct its business and to elect its officers. Additional meetings shall be held as necessary to conduct the business of the board and may be convened at the call

F. Refuse to renew a license. The board shall hold an adjudicatory hearing at the written request of any person who is denied a license without a hearing for any reason other than failure to pay a required fee, provided the request for hearing is received by the board within 30 days of the applicant's receipt of written notice of the denial of application, the reasons for denial and the right of the applicant to request a hearing. Hearings shall be conducted in conformity with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act. Title 5, chapter 375. To the extent applicable, the board may subpoena witnesses, records and documents in any hearing it conducts. J. Disciplinary actions: grounds. The following are grounds for disciplinary action: A. The practice of fraud or deceit in obtaining a license under this chapter or in connection with service rendered within the scope of the license issued: B. Engaging in unprofessional conduct. A licensee engages in unprofessional conduct if the licensee violates any standard of professional behavior which reflects negligence, incompetency or misconduct in the practice of land surveying: C. Subject to the limitations of Title 5, chapter 341, conviction of a crime which involves dishonesty or false statement or which relates directly to the practice for which the individual is licensed or convicted of any crime for which imprisonment for one year or more may be imposed; or D. Any violation of this chapter or rules adopted by the board. 4. Reinstatement. An application for reinstatement may be made to the board after one year from the date of revocation of a license. 21	procedure for the processing of complaints, updates provisions to
2.2	regulate the profession of professional surveying as it exists
23	today and increases the maximum fee that professional surveyors can be charged for licensure from \$60 to \$100 annually.
