IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Amend the Alternative Election Procedure for School Budgets on a Local Basis.



1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §1305, sub-§3, as repealed and replaced by PL 1983, c. 770, §3, is amended to read:

7	3. Failure to approve a budget. If Except in districts which have voted to proceed under section 1305-A, if the budget
9	or portion of the budget fails to receive a majority vote at the referendum, the board of directors shall decide in a public
1 1	proceeding whether subsequent votes on the portion of the budget which was defeated shall be conducted in accordance with the referendum procedure in subsection 2, or at a district budget
13	meeting held at a single place in the district, in accordance with procedures in sections 1303 and 1304. These referenda or
15	meetings shall be held solely for the purpose of approving an alternative operating school budget to replace the part of the
17	proposed budget which the voters failed to approve. The board may continue in this manner until an alternative budget is
19	adopted.
21	Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §1305-A is enacted to read:
23	§1305-A. Citizen-initiated alternative budget proposal procedure

27	If requested by a written petition of at least 10% of the number of voters voting in the last gubernatorial election in the

43	1. Procedure. The procedure for voting on the article shall be as follows.

45	A. On receipt of a request and if the request complies with the requirements of this section, the board of directors
47	shall immediately notify the municipal officers within the
49	district of the receipt of the request.
51	B. The municipal officers of each municipality within the district shall then cause the article to be placed on the

	2. Citizen-initiated proposals; petition. Following the
37	board of directors' declaration that the article has passed, the
	voters may petition to place on the warrant one or more articles
39	proposing a part or all of an operating school budget as an
	alternative to the operating school budget submitted by the
41	board. The board shall place the article on the warrant if it
	receives a written petition of at least 10% of the number of
43	voters voting in the last gubernatorial election in the
	municipalities within the district.

	3. No alternative budget approved. If the voters fail to
47	approve a part or all of the operating school budget submitted by
	the board and if the voters fail to approve a citizen-initiated
49	alternative budget proposal or there is no citizen-initiated
	budget proposal on the warrant, the procedures for alternative
51	budget approval under section 1305, subsection 3, apply.

4. Reconsideration of citizen-initiated alternative budget proposal procedure. If a school administrative district has adopted the citizen-initiated alternative budget proposal procedure in accordance with this section, then the board of directors may submit the following article to the voters not more than once every 3 years to determine if the district will change its budget approval procedure to the procedure set out in section 1305, subsection 3.

"Shall School Administrative District No.... change its budget approval procedure so that future district budget meetings and special district budget meetings do not provide for citizen-initiated alternative budget proposals?

A. The process for reconsideration may be initiated either by the board of directors or by a written petition of at least 10% of the number of voters voting in the last gubernatorial election in the municipalities within the district.

B. The procedure for voting on the article and for carrying out the election shall be that set forth in subsection 1.

 C. If the article passes, then future district budgets will be adopted in accordance with section 1305. If the article fails to pass, then citizen-initiated alternative budget proposals may be included in the warrant under this section, and alternative budgets may be approved only as provided in this section.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to eliminate multiple school administrative district budget meetings and votes when the budget submitted by the board of directors is not approved by the first vote. Under current law, the board must continue to present revised budgets until the voters of the district approve one.

This bill allows the voters in districts to choose by referendum whether to allow citizen-initiated alternative budget proposals at the budget election. If the district does allow the alternative budget proposals, no additional votes can be taken on the budget if the board's budget is not approved in its entirety and one or more citizen-initiated alternative proposals are approved. If no citizen-initiated budget proposal is approved, or no citizen-initiated budget proposal is on the warrant, and the budget submitted by the board is not approved, the current law will apply; the board must submit revised budgets to

- district meetings until one is approved. The voters of the district may reconsider the decision to allow the
- 3 citizen-initiated proposals and prohibit additional votes on the budget.
