An Act to Make Allocations for the Administrative Expenses of the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages, Department of Finance, for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1990 and June 30, 1991.

(EMERGENCY)



Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not 1 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 3 5 Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and 7 Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages and the State 9 Liquor Commission will become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1989; and 11 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts 13 create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 15 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 17 safety; now, therefore, Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 19 Sec. 1.
