Resolve, to Establish the Commission to Study the Use of Professional Strikebreakers.

(EMERGENCY)



Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the use of professional strikebreakers to replace striking employees in the State has created an atmosphere of tension and resentment within the State and raised charges that it provides employers with an unfair advantage in contract negotiations; and

Whereas, the need for legislation on this subject and the ability of the State to enact this legislation in the face of potential federal preemption has been a subject of heated debate with no clear resolution of these complex issues; and

Whereas, the use of professional strikebreakers potentially affects, directly or indirectly, a large portion of the State's populace and requires a prompt, impartial and complete investigation and resolution of the issue; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Commission created and charged. Resolved: That the Commission to Study the Use of Professional Strikebreakers is established. The commission shall study the use of professional strikebreakers in labor disputes and evaluate its impact upon collective bargaining between employees and their employer. If the commission finds that the use of professional strikebreakers upsets the balance of bargaining power between employees and employers and contributes to the potential for violence during a labor dispute, the commission shall investigate and recommend ways in which the potential for violence may be reduced by achieving a proper balance of bargaining power within the constraints of federal preemption under the National Labor Relations Act or other federal laws; and be it further

Appointment. Resolved: That the commission shall consist of 6 members appointed as follows:

1. One representative of the executive branch appointed by the Governor;

- One representative of organized labor appointed by the Governor;
- 3. One representative of employers appointed by the 51 Governor;

15	Professional Strikebreakers which may suggest any necessary legislation. The commission is composed of 6 members. Three

19	representing employers. The President of the Senate and the
er V	Speaker of the House appoint one Legislator each and the Chief
21	Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court appoints one retired judge or justice. The commission is required to report to the Second

Regular Session of the 114th Legislature by January 1, 1990.

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
