An Act Concerning Voting Procedures for School District Budgets.

1		Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3		Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §1302, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 693, §§5 and 8, is amended to read:

19		1. Referendum. The district budget shall be submitted to
21		the voters of the district for approval. The voting shall be by referendum held in each municipality in the district, in

- <u>4. Board responsibilities.</u> The board may hold
  <u>informational meetings on voting procedure and budget prior to</u> voting. The board shall be responsible for the form of the
   <u>articles to be voted on in the municipalities, except as</u> otherwise provided by law.

## <u>§1303-B. Failure to approve a budget</u>

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If the budget or portion of the budget fails to receive a 13 majority vote at the referendum, the board of directors shall decide in a public proceeding whether subsequent votes on the 15 portion of the budget which was defeated shall be conducted in accordance with the referendum procedure in section 1303-A, or at 17 a district budget meeting held at a single place in the district, in accordance with procedures in sections 1305-A to 1305-C. 19 These referenda or meetings shall be held solely for the purpose of approving an alternative operating school budget to replace 21 the part of the proposed budget which the voters failed to approve. The board may continue in this manner until an 23 alternative budget is adopted.

35 If requested by a written petition of at least 10% of the number of voters voting in the last gubernatorial election in the 37 municipalities within the district, the board of directors shall cause the following article to be voted on by the voters of the 39 member municipalities.

Procedure. The procedure for voting on the article
 shall be as follows.

51 <u>A. On receipt of a request and if the request complies with</u> the requirement of this section, the board of directors shall immediately notify the municipal officers within the district of the receipt of the request.

B. The municipal officers of each municipality within the district shall then cause the article to be placed on the ballots for that municipality for the next statewide election occurring at least 45 days after the date on which the municipal officers received the notice.

C. The warrants, notices and voting procedures to be followed within a municipality, including absentee voting procedures, shall be the same as those provided in Title 21, except that the duties of the Secretary of State shall be performed by the board of directors.

D. Municipal clerks shall, within 24 hours of the determination of the results of the vote in their municipality, certify to the board of directors the total number of votes cast in the affirmative and in the negative on the article.

E. As soon as all the results from all the municipalities have been returned to the board of directors, the board shall meet and compute the total number of votes cast in the affirmative and in the negative on the article in all the municipalities within the district.

F. If the board of directors determines that there were more votes cast in the affirmative than there were in the negative on the article, they shall declare that the article has passed.

G. If the board of directors determines that the total number of votes cast on the article in the affirmative is
 equal to or less than those in the negative, they shall declare that the article has not passed.

 H. The board of directors shall enter their declaration and computations in their records and send certified copies of it to the municipal clerk of each municipality within the district.

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43 <u>2. Application.</u> Following the board of director's declaration that the article has passed, the board shall cause
 45 the voting on all future district budgets to be by district meeting.

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1. The process for reconsideration may be initiated either by the board of directors or by a written petition of at least 10% of the number of voters voting in the last gubernatorial election in the municipalities within the district.

2. The procedure for voting on the article and for carrying 9 out the election shall be as set forth in this section.

11 3. If the article passes, future district budgets shall be adopted in accordance with section 1303-A; if the article fails 13 to pass, the alternative voting procedure shall continue to be the process for adopting budgets in the district.

Sec. 7. 20-A MRSA §1309, as amended by PL 1983, c. 806, §19, is further amended to read: 17

§1309. Special budget meeting 19

21 The school board may call a special budget meeting when they deelare it declares an emergency to exist. The voters of the district may authorize the directors at a special district budget 23 meeting to pledge the credit of the district to obtain additional moneys money for the operation of schools. The special budget 25 meeting shall be held in accordance with sections 1302 - 1305 - B to 27 1307 1305-D.

- Sec. 8. 20-A MRSA §1310, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1983, c. 485, §14, is further amended to read:
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1. Warrant. In accordance with the budget approved by the voters at an annual budget referendum or meeting and in substantially the same form as the warrant of the Treasurer of 35 State for taxes, the board of directors shall issue its warrants to the assessors of each member municipality requiring them to assess upon the taxable estates within the municipality an amount which is that municipality's share of the district's costs.

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## STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of the bill is to change the method of approving 45 a school administrative district budget. Currently, the budget is approved at a single district-wide meeting. Voters in the 47 district may vote, however, to adopt an alternative procedure which permits voters to vote on the budget at separate referenda held in each municipality. 49 The bill would make the municipal referendum the automatic method of approval. Voters could vote 51 to have an alternative approval process of a single district meeting.
