An Act Relating to the Admission of Federal Administrative Law Judges to the
Maine Bar.



1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

3 4 MRSA §802-A is enacted to read:

5 §802-A. Administrative Law Judges

7 Administrative Law Judges domiciled in this State who have
9 been appointed in accordance with the provisions of the United
11 States Code, Title 5, Section 553 may be admitted to the general
13 practice of law in this State upon motion in the Supreme Judicial
15 Court without complying with section 805-A.

16 STATEMENT OF FACT

17 The purpose of this bill is to permit federal Administrative
19 Law Judges, domiciled in Maine, to gain admission to the Maine
Bar without having to take an examination or meet the other
requirements generally applied to candidates for admission to the
practice of law in Maine.
