### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act Making Allocations Related to the Alcoholism Prevention, Education, Treatment and Research Fund for the Expenditures of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1990, and June 30, 1991.

(EMERGENCY)



1 Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted 3 as emergencies; and 5 Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of certain departments will become due and payable on 7 or immediately after July 1, 1989; and 9 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 11 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 13 safety; now, therefore, Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 15 Sec. 1. Allocation of Alcoholism Prevention, Education, Treatment 17 and Research Fund. Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect July 1, 1989.

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#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to make allocations related to the Alcoholism Prevention, Education, Treatment and Research Fund for the fiscal years ending June 30, 1990, and June 30, 1991. Both years are flat funded and do not include adjustments due to the limited income of the premium fund. This bill allocates the fund so that the affected agencies may continue to operate in fiscal years 1989-90 and 1990-91.
