

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**An Act Making Allocations Related to the Alcoholism Prevention, Education, Treatment and Research Fund for the Expenditures of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1990, and June 30, 1991.**

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(EMERGENCY)



1           **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not  
2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted  
3 as emergencies; and

5           Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the  
6 operation of certain departments will become due and payable on  
7 or immediately after July 1, 1989; and

9           Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts  
10 create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of  
11 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately  
12 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and  
13 safety; now, therefore,

15           **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

17           **Sec. 1. Allocation of Alcoholism Prevention, Education, Treatment**  
18 **and Research Fund.** Income to the Alcoholism Prevention,  
19 Education, Treatment and Research Fund for fiscal years 1989-90  
20 and 1990-91 shall be segregated, apportioned and disbursed as  
21 designated in the following schedule:

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**Sec. 2. Coordination.** The Department of Corrections, Department of Educational and Cultural Services, Department of Human Services and Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation shall coordinate, to the greatest extent possible, their goals, education, treatment, prevention and research programs. Before expending any educational and training funds, a department shall submit the plans for the program to the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Planning Committee established by the Legislature to ensure coordination of policy and service.

**Sec. 3. Accountability.** The Alcohol and Drug Abuse Planning Committee shall report to the Legislature, by the first day of each regular session of the Legislature, the actions taken by the departments pursuant to the allocations made from this fund. The report shall include a description of each program and

1 actions taken expending funds for alcoholism prevention,  
training, education, treatment and research. The source of funds  
3 expended, whether federal, state or private grants, shall be  
identified. In addition, the committee shall provide a report on  
5 drug abuse, including a description of all programs and  
expenditures of all funds. The reports may include  
7 recommendations and outline issues which the Legislature,  
departments and the committee may wish to address.

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11 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the  
preamble, this Act shall take effect July 1, 1989.

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### STATEMENT OF FACT

17 The purpose of this bill is to make allocations related to  
the Alcoholism Prevention, Education, Treatment and Research Fund  
19 for the fiscal years ending June 30, 1990, and June 30, 1991.  
Both years are flat funded and do not include adjustments due to  
21 the limited income of the premium fund. This bill allocates the  
fund so that the affected agencies may continue to operate in  
23 fiscal years 1989-90 and 1990-91.
