IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act Making Appropriations from the General Fund for the Expenditures of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1990, and June 30, 1991.

(EMERGENCY)

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not 1 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted 3 as emergencies; and Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the 5 operation of certain departments will become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1989; and 7 9 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately 11 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 13 safety; now, therefore, Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 15 Sec. 1. 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Sec. 2. Coordination. The Department of Corrections, 25 Department of Educational and Cultural Services, Department of Human Services and Department of Mental Health and Mental 27 Retardation shall coordinate, to the greatest extent possible, their goals, education, treatment, prevention and research 29 programs. Before expending any educational and training funds, a department shall submit the plans for the program to the Alcohol 31 and Drug Abuse Planning Committee established by the Legislature to ensure coordination of policy and service.

Sec. 3. Accountability. The Alcohol and Drug Abuse Planning 35 Committee shall report to the Legislature, by the first day of each regular session of the Legislature, the actions taken by the 37 departments pursuant to the allocations made from this fund. The report shall include a description of each program and actions 39 expending funds for alcoholism prevention, training, taken education, treatment and research. The source of funds expended, 41 whether federal, state or private grants, shall be identified. In addition, the committee shall provide a report on drug abuse, 43 including a description of all programs and expenditures of all funds. The reports may include recommendations and outline 45 issues which the Legislature, departments and the committee may wish to address.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the 49 preamble, this Act shall take effect July 1, 1989.

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STATEMENT OF FACT		
The purpose of this bill is to make appropriations from the		
General Fund for the fiscal years ending June 30, 1990, and June		
30, 1991. The General Fund money allows for the continuation of		
premium fund substance abuse programs at their current level by		
providing a cost-of-living adjustment. This appropriation allows		
affected agencies to continue to operate in fiscal years 1989-90		
and 1990-91.		

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
