An Act to Improve the Cost-of-living Adjustment Under the Maine State Retirement System.



1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §17806, sub-§1, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 801, §§5 and 7, is amended to read:

	A. Whenever there is a percentage change in the Consumer
7	Price Index from July 1st to June 30th, the board shall automatically make an equal percentage increase or decrease
9	in retirement benefits, beginning in September, up to a maximum-annual-inerease-er-deerease-ef-4%.

15	STATEMENT OF FACT

_ ·	The current retirement system law limits cost-of-living
19	adjustments to a maximum of 4% per year. This has resulted in substantial losses to inflation for retirees, many of whom rely
21	on these pension benefits as their sole or primary source of
	income during their retirement years. This bill removes the 4%
23	cap under the Maine State Retirement System and bases future cost-of-living adjustments on the Consumer Price Index.
