(EMERGENCY)



1	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted
3	as emergencies; and
5 7	Whereas, the law requiring municipalities to accept funds provided by the Legislature only upon affirmative vote of the municipal legislative body becomes effective on July 1, 1989; and
9	Whereas, the law has created considerable confusion among
	municipal legislative bodies; and
L1 L3	Whereas, municipalities will not be prepared to comply with this law by July 1, 1989; and
L5 L7 19	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
21	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
23	30 MRSA §5058, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 816, Pt. KK, §22, is amended to read:
25 27	§5058. Funding
29 31	Effective July 1, 1989 1990, municipalities shall accept funds provided by the Legislature only upon an affirmative vote of their legislative bodies. Those municipalities holding a town meeting shall include a separate article on the warrant for each
33	category of state funding which shall read as follows: "Shall the town vote to accept (category of funding) as provided by the Maine State Legislature?". The town shall indicate an estimate
35	of the amount to be received for each category of state funding on the warrant, but it does not have to be part of the article.
37	Those funds not accepted by any municipality shall remain with the State. This section applies to any town meeting held after
39	January 1, 1990.
41 43	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
	STATEMENT OF FACT
45	
47	This bill postpones the date by which municipalities are required to obtain an affirmative vote of their legislative
49	bodies before accepting funds provided by the Legislature. Under current law, the date this requirement becomes effective is July

- 1 1, 1989. This bill sets a new date of April 1, 1990 to allow municipalities enough time to understand and comply with this
- requirement. Under this bill, the affirmative vote of a municipal legislative body at a town meeting held after January
- 5 1, 1990, will satisfy the affirmative vote requirement.
