IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Provide a Penalty on Delinquent Public Utilities.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 1 3 . . 35-A MRSA §1510 is enacted to read: 5 §1510. Penalty for failure to file 7 1. Penalty. Any public utility which fails to file a report with the commission as required by this Title or fails to g file for and secure approval or authorization of the commission before taking action as required by this Title shall pay to the commission the sum of \$100 for each 30-day period, or portion of 11 that period, that the public utility is delinquent . The penalty 13 shall be paid at the time the utility files its report or files for approval or authorization. In no case may the penalty under 15 this section exceed \$1,000. 17 2. Excuse. The commission may excuse a utility from all or part of the penalty if it finds that the failure to file was the 19 result of excusable neglect. 3. Disposition of penalties. Penalties collected by the 21 commission under this section shall be deposited in the Public 23 Utilities Commission Reimbursement Fund under section 117. 25 STATEMENT OF FACT 27 29 This bill imposes a modest penalty on public utilities which fail to file reports or fail to file for approval of the Public 31 Utilities Commission of certain action as required by law. penalty provides additional incentive for the timely filing of reports and petitions to reduce the number of delinquent filings 33 and the resulting administrative burden on the Public Utilities 35 Commission. The Public Utilities Commission may excuse all or part of the penalty upon finding excusable neglect.
