An Act to Clarify the Common Boundary of the Town of Cape Elizabeth and the Town of Scarborough.

Land of the same

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Boundary line between the Town of Cape Elizabeth and the Town of
Scarborough. The boundary line between the Town of Cape
Elizabeth and the Town of Scarborough in the County of Cumberland
shall commence at a granite monument at the intersection of the
municipal boundary lines of Scarborough, South Portland and Cape
Elizabeth, the monument being South 55° 06' 50" East a distance
of 2210.11 feet from a granite monument on the Westerly side of
Highland Avenue as shown on "Plan of Survey for Scarborough-South
Portland Town Line" recorded in the Cumberland County Registry of
Deeds in Plan Book 133, page 67.

Thence South 55° 06' 50" East 2174.42 feet to a granite monument set on the town line between Cape Elizabeth and Scarborough marked C.E.-SC.;

Thence South 55° 06' 50" East a distance of 192 feet more or less, to the center line of the Spurwink River;

Thence in a general Southeasterly direction by the center line of the Spurwink River;

Thence in a general Southwesterly direction by the center line of the Spurwink River as it flows to the Atlantic Ocean at Higgins Beach.
