33	This bill proposes to make better use of the Maine
35	Children's Trust Fund by putting most of its resources into community-based programs that provide services directly to
37	children in need. The bill does this by eliminating duties which others are performing and changing the ratio of money spent on
39	staff from approximately 60% to 20%.
1	This bill amends the duties of the Board of the Maine Children's Trust Fund by eliminating the need for an annual plan,
3	by eliminating the mandatory exchange of information, by eliminating the provision of statewide education and public
<u>.</u> 5	information and by eliminating the staff. The bill mandates that staffing for the board will be provided by the Department of Human Services to be reimbursed in an amount up to \$20,000 per

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year.
