15	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting
17	clause and before the statement of fact and inserting in its place the following:

21	'38 MRSA §438-A, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 815, $\S\S$ 5 and 11, is amended to read:
23	4. Failure to adopt ordinances. If a municipality fails to adopt ordinances as required under this article or if the board
25	determines that an ordinance which a municipality has adopted does not satisfy the requirements and purposes under this
27	article, the board, acting in accordance with Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II, shall adopt suitable ordinances, or suitable
29	provisions of ordinances, on behalf of the municipality.  Notwithstanding subsections 2 and 3, if the board determines that
31	special water quality considerations on a great pond warrant more
	restrictive standards than those contained in the minimum
33	guidelines, the board may adopt the additional standards for all
35	municipalities outside the jurisdiction of the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission which abut those waters. Following
35	adoption by the board, these ordinances or provisions shall be
37	effective and binding within the municipality and shall be
39	administered and enforced by that municipality.

7	zoning regulations to all municipalities abutting a great pond
	that warrant special water quality considerations if those
9	ordinances are imposed on one municipality.
