29	Whereas, this legislation extends the authority of the Department of Marine Resources to monitor contamination to ensure the public's health; and

susceptible species of marine mollusks in areas not shown to be
affected by contamination.

2. Responsibilities. The department shall be the state
agency responsible for implementing the program. The department
may adopt rules under section 6172 as may be warranted to provide
for adequate protection of the public health.
Further amend the bill by inserting before the statement of
fact the following:
'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the
preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.'
STATEMENT OF FACT
This amendment adds an emergency preamble and emergency
clause and corrects a headnote in the law to make it consistent
with the amended program name. It also clarifies the name of the
program which monitors marine toxins in shellfish.
