15	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting
17	clause and before the statement of fact and inserting in its place the following:
19	'Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6671, sub-§3-A, ¶C, as enacted by PL 1989,
21	c. 257, §4, is amended to read:
23	C. Application methods and procedures for licenses may be determined by the shellfish conservation ordinance subject
25	to the provisions of this section <u>and shall be the same for</u> residents and <u>nonresidents</u> . Notice of the number and the
27	procedure for application shall be published in a trade or industry publication or in a newspaper or combination of
29	newspapers with general circulation which the municipal officers consider effective in reaching persons affected not
31	less than 10 days prior to the period of issuance and shall be posted in the municipal offices until the period
33	concludes. The period of issuance for resident and nonresident licenses shall be the same. Subsequent to that
35	period, the municipality shall make any resident or nonresident licenses not granted during the period available
37	to residents or nonresidents.
39	Sec. 2. Effective date. This Act shall take effect January 1, 1990.'
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HOUSE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 620, L.D. 843

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment completely replaces the language in the 3 original bill. Rather than mandating that municipalities issue their clam digging licenses on a first-come, first-serve basis, 5 this amendment simply requires that the procedure for issuing 7 licenses be the same for residents and nonresidents alike. This provision will take effect January 1, 1990. 9
