25 27	Whereas, a substantial proportion of Maine's municipalities are dependent upon volunteer ambulance crews and volunteer fire departments for fire protection and ambulance services; and
29	Whereas, it is essential that volunteer ambulance and fire crews receive proper training to undertake their duties; and
31	crows receive proper craiming to andereage their ductes, and
33	Whereas, the amount of training and methods of providing training are nebulous; and
35	Whereas, many municipalities are experiencing serious shortages of volunteers in their ambulance and fire crews; and

- 2. Two Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the 9 House of Representatives to include one Democrat and one Republican;
- 3. Two representatives of volunteer fire departments appointed by the Governor;
- 15 4. Two representatives of volunteer ambulance crews appointed by the Governor;
- 5. One representative of a nonvolunteer fire department appointed by the Governor;
- 21 6. One representative of a nonvolunteer ambulance crew appointed by the Governor;

- 7. The State Fire Marshall or a designee who shall be from the Fire Training Service; and
- 8. The chair of the Emergency Medical Services Board or the chair's designee; and be it further
  - Study. Resolved: That the commission, in consultation with the Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Standards, Division of Safety, study the problems confronting volunteer ambulance crews and volunteer fire departments. The study shall include but not be limited to:
  - The impact of state-mandated training requirements on the ability of volunteer fire departments and ambulance crews to recruit and retain volunteers;
- 2. The amount and type of training and the methods of providing training that best meet the needs of municipalities and volunteers:
- 3. Providing adequate protective gear for volunteers and the means of financing the acquisition of protective gear;
- 4. The alternatives which volunteer ambulance services and volunteer fire departments may adopt to provide satisfactory levels of services. These alternatives shall include the costs, benefits and safety impact associated with each alternative;

19	Further amend the resolve in the 6th paragraph, by striking out the last sentence (page 1, lines 45 to 48 in L.D.) and					
21	inserting in its place the following:					
23	'All members of the commission, except the employees of State Government, shall receive reimbursement for expenses in					
25	accordance with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 379 upon application to the Executive Director of the Legislative

29	Further amend the resolve by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:					
31	'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the					
33	preamble, this resolve shall take effect on adjournment of the First Regular Session of the 114th Legislature.

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41	This amendment adds an emergency preamble and an emergency clause in order for the commission to report its findings and any necessary implementing legislation to the Legislature by December					
43	1, 1989. In addition, this amendment provides more criteria to guide the commission in its study. This amendment also requires					
45	the commission to consult with the Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Standards, Division of Safety, in conducting the study.					
47	This amendment makes some technical changes including the calling of the first meeting by the chair of the Legislative Council.
