**Resolve, to Establish the Commission to Study the Preservation of Volunteer Ambulance Crews and Volunteer Fire Departments.** 



Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study the Preservation of Volunteer Ambulance Crews and Volunteer Fire Departments is established; and be it further

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Membership. Resolved: That the commission shall consist of 5 the following 12 members to be appointed within 30 days of the 7 effective date of this resolve: two Senators appointed by the President of the Senate, including one Democrat and one q Republican; 2 members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House, including one Democrat and one 11 Republican; 6 nonlegislative members appointed by the Governor, including 2 representatives of volunteer fire departments, 2 representatives of volunteer ambulance crews, one representative 13 of a nonvolunteer fire department and one representative of a nonvolunteer ambulance crew; and the State Fire Marshal and the 15 chair of the Emergency Medical Services Board, or their 17 designees; and be it further

19 Study. Resolved: That the commission study the impact of state-mandated training requirements on the ability of volunteer 21 fire departments and ambulance crews to recruit and retain volunteers. The commission shall examine the cost and time volunteers in accordance 23 required to train with current requirements. The commission shall consider feasible alternative 25 requirements be applied to volunteer firefighters to and ambulance crews and shall review the costs, benefits and safety 27 impact of these alternatives; and be it further

Convening of commission. Resolved: That when the appointment 29 of all commission members is complete, the Governor shall call the commission together for its first meeting within 30 days. At 31 the first meeting, the members shall elect a chair and other officers; and be it further 33

**Report.** Resolved: That the commission submit its report, 35 together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the 37 114th Legislature no later than December 1, 1989; and be it further 39

Staff; compensation. Resolved: That the commission shall request necessary staff assistance from the Legislative Council. The members of the commission who are Legislators shall receive 43 the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, for days in attendance at section 2, 45 commission meetings. All members of the commission, except the employees of State Government, shall receive reimbursement for expenses upon application to the Executive Director of the 47 Legislative Council; and be it further

Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.
