COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 625, L.D. 848, Bill, "An Act Relating to Ordinary Death Benefits Under the Maine State Retirement System"

Amend the bill by inserting before the statement of fact the following:

'Sec. 9. Expenditure in excess of allocations. Expenditure of funds in other than the General Fund and the Highway Fund may, during the biennium, exceed legislatively authorized allocations by the amount necessary to cover the increase in retirement rates required to carry out the purposes of this Act.

Sec. 10. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.
