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An Act Concerning the Reporting of Alleged Child Abuse.

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	22 MRSA §4010-A is enacted to read:
5	<u>§4010-A. Child abuse policies</u>
7	1. Policy development. Every public or private institution, agency, facility or other organization that provides
9	<u>services or care of any kind to children shall develop a written</u> policy outlining its course of action if allegations of physical
11 13	<u>or sexual child abuse or other related allegations are made against it or one or more of its employees.</u>
15	2. Filing. Any policy developed pursuant to subsection 1 must be filed with the state agency or department that licenses
17	<u>or regulates the institution, agency, facility or other</u> organization filing the policy. If no such state agency or
19	<u>department exists, the policy shall be filed with the Department</u> of Human Services.
21	3. Time for filing. Any policy developed pursuant to subsection 1 shall be filed by January 1, 1990, or, for an
23	institution, agency, facility or other organization not existing before that date, January 1st of the year following the calendar
25	year that it comes into existence.
27	4. Availability of policy. An institution, agency, facility or other organization under subsection 1 shall make a
29 31	<u>copy of its policy available to the public and to its employees, upon request, during regular business hours.</u>
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35	STATEMENT OF FACT
37	This bill requires any public or private institution, agency, facility or other organization that provides services of any kind to children to develop and make available to the public
39	or its employees a policy outlining its course of action if allegations of physical or sexual child abuse or other related
41	allegations are made against it or one or more of its employees. Policies developed pursuant to this bill must be filed with the
43	licensing or regulating state agency or department of the institution, agency, facility or other organization by January 1,
