An Act Regarding Traveling Barbers.



1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

3 **32 MRSA §1552, sub-§2**, as amended by PL 1987, c. 395, Pt. A,
5 §146, is further amended to read:

7 **2. Exceptions.** The practice of cosmetology shall be carried
9 on only by persons duly licensed to practice in this State and
11 only in a licensed beauty shop, except as provided in this
13 subsection. A duly licensed cosmetologist may, when charging the
15 usual fees, practice cosmetology:

17 A. Upon On patients in hospitals or nursing homes;

19 B. Upon On residents of summer camps;

21 C. Upon On inmates or residents of institutions of the
23 Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation and the
25 Department of Corrections;

27 D. Upon On an invalid or handicapped person in that
29 person's place of residence;

31 E. Upon On a resident of a nursing home;

33 F. Upon On a hotel or motel occupant in that person's hotel
35 or motel room; and

37 G. Upon On a person in the person's residence, ~~when done~~
 ~~for the usual fees, ; or~~

H. On persons in their private businesses.

STATEMENT OF FACT

 The bill allows beauticians to practice cosmetology on
 persons in private businesses.
