Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not 29 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 31 Whereas, it is the belief of the Joint Standing Committee 33 on Utilities that the Public Utilities Commission should make provisions for the establishment of a system to provide 35 continuous telephone relay services for deaf, hearing impaired or speech impaired persons who must rely on teletypewriter equipment 37 for telephone communications; and 39 Whereas, for the Public Utilities Commission to complete the study outlined in this Act, the commission should start as 41 soon as possible; 43 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 45 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 47 safety; now, therefore,' 40 Further amend the bill by striking everything after the enacting clause and inserting in its place the following: 51 'Sec. 1. Public Utilities Commission Study. The Public Utilities 53 Commission shall undertake а study of the

Consultation with and cooperation of other agencies. The 23 Public Utilities Commission shall consult with appropriate agencies and organizations serving the deaf community, with 25 representatives of the deaf community and with relevant state agencies. The other state agencies shall cooperate with the 27 Public Utilities Commission in conducting the study. 29 Sec. 3. Report. The Public Utilities Commission shall report their findings to the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities by 31 January 5, 1990. The report shall include a legislative proposal for the implementation of a plan to provide continuous telephone 33 relay services. Sec. 4. Staff. The Public Utilities Commission may contract 35 for services to complete this study. 37 Sec. 5. Appropriation. | 11 | Fund to pay for consultant services and commission staff time. |
