Passamaquoddy Tribal Court to keep the 2 subparagraphs consistent. A typographical mistake is also corrected.

This amendment delays the effective date of the bill until

October 1, 1990, to enable the Passamaquoddy Tribe to prepare for
the expanded court jurisdiction, including the preparation of
facilities.
