#### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

Resolve, to Create the Commission to Study the Feasibility of a Materials Recovery Facility.

Commission established; membership. Resolved: Commission to Study the Feasibility of a Materials Recovery Facility is established. The commission shall be comprised of the following members to be appointed within 30 days of the effective date of this resolve: 2 Senators, including one Democrat and one Republican, and 2 members of the House of Representatives, including one Democrat and one Republican from the Joint Standing Committee on Energy and Natural Resources and the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government to be appointed by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House respectively; one representative of the Office of Waste Recycling and Reduction to be appointed by the director of that office; one representative of the Department of Environmental appointed by the commissioner Protection to be department; and one representative of the general public who has experience in or knowledge of solid waste management to be appointed by the Governor. The Governor shall designate one member as chair who shall appoint other officers as needed. Governor shall promptly notify the Legislative Council of the appointment; and be it further

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Staff; compensation. Resolved: That the commission shall request necessary staff assistance from the Legislative Council. The members of the commission who are Legislators shall receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for days in attendance at commission meetings. All members of the commission shall receive reimbursement for expenses upon application to the Legislative Council; and be it further

Study. Resolved: That the commission study the feasibility of a publicly owned and privately operated materials recovery facility; and be it further

Convening of commission. Resolved: That, when the appointment of all commission members is completed, the Governor shall call the commission together for its first meeting within 60 days of the effective date of this resolve; and be it further

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Report. Resolved: That the commission submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 114th Legislature no later than December 1, 1989; and be it further

Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.
