An Act to Change the Premium on Alcoholic Beverages.

(AFTER DEADLINE)



1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	28-A MRSA §1703, sub-§3, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 45, Pt. A, §4, is amended to read:

	3. Amount of premium. The premium imposed by subsections 1
7	and 2 is:
9	A. Ten <u>Twenty-five</u> cents per gallon on all malt beverages sold in the State;

13	B. Thirty Seventy-five cents per gallon on all wine, other than sparkling wine, sold in the State;
15	C. Twenty-four Sixty cents per gallon on all sparkling wine sold in the State; and

	D. One-dollar-and-twenty-five Three dollars and fifteen
19	cents per proof gallon as the term proof gallon is defined in the United States Code, Title 26, Section 5002, on all

25	STATEMENT OF FACT
27	This bill raises the premium on alcoholic beverages by varying amounts. The specified amounts are derived by
41	varying amounts. The specified amounts are derived by calculating the premium at 5 cents per ounce of absolute alcohol
29	and rounding where necessary to the closest 5 cents, as opposed to the current formula which is based on 2 cents per ounce of

absolute alcohol.
