NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

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An Act to Make Allocations from the Transportation Safety Fund for  
the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1990, and June 30, 1991.

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(EMERGENCY)



1           **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not  
3 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted  
as emergencies; and

5           Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the  
beginning of the next fiscal year; and

7           Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the  
9 operation of the Department of Public Safety will become due and  
payable on or immediately after July 1, 1989; and

11           Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts  
13 create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of  
Maine and require the following legislation as immediately  
15 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and  
safety; now, therefore,

17           **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

19           **Sec. 1. 29 MRSA §2713, sub-§3, ¶A,** as repealed and replaced by  
21 PL 1987, c. 769, Pt. A, §116, is amended to read:

23           A. There shall be allocated to the Department of Public  
25 Safety for the State Police up to \$1,200,000--annually  
\$1,900,000 in fiscal year 1990 and \$1,900,000 in fiscal year  
27 1991 from the fund to carry out the duties of the bureau  
imposed by this chapter and Title 35-A and for related  
activities.

29           **Sec. 2. Adjustments to allocations.** Allocations may be increased  
31 or adjusted by the State Budget Officer, with the approval of the  
Governor, to specifically cover those adjustments determined to  
33 be necessary under any salary plan approved by the Legislature,  
and those reclassifications or range changes which have been  
35 approved by the Department of Administration and submitted for  
legislative review prior to the effective date of this Act.

37           **Sec. 3. Encumbered balance at year end.** At the end of each  
39 fiscal year, all encumbered balances shall not be carried forward  
more than once.

41           **Sec. 4. Allocation of Transportation Safety Fund.** Income to the  
43 Transportation Safety Fund for the next 2 fiscal years, from July  
1, 1989, to June 30, 1990, and from July 1, 1990, to June 30,  
45 1991, shall be segregated, apportioned and disbursed as  
designated in the following schedule:

designated in the following schedule:
