#### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Provide Assistance to Businesses Adversely Affected by Snow Drought.

(EMERGENCY) (After Deadline)



Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the lack of snowfall in much of the State during December and January of the winter of 1988-89 has had a detrimental effect on many of the businesses which depend on snowfall for sales and services, threatening the survival of some businesses and threatening some employees with loss of their jobs; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- Sec. 1. 10 MRSA §1012, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 159, §1, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
- 23 <u>1. Purpose. The authority shall administer the Maine Natural Disaster Business Assistance Program for the purpose of providing assistance to businesses that are victims of natural disasters which have either:</u>

A. Caused the State or portions of the State to be declared disaster areas by the President of the United States or the President's authorized representative; or

B. Been designated by the Legislature as natural disasters for purposes of the program and for which appropriations have been made to the Natural Disaster Business Assistance Fund.

Sec. 2. 10 MRSA §1012, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 159, §1, is amended to read:

4. Criteria. No financial assistance may be approved unless the authority determines that there is a reasonable likelihood that the applicant will be able to repay any loan made or secured under the program, that the applicant has demonstrated that it has insufficient access to other sources of funds and that the financial assistance is needed to assure the recovery of the applicant from the effects of the natural disaster. All applications—must—be—received—not—later—than—June—30,—1987. The authority, by rules adopted in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, may establish temporary reservations for geographic areas of the State and may establish such other criteria as may be consistent with the purposes of the program.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides \$1,000,000 from the Rainy Day Fund to be used for direct loans to businesses which have been adversely affected by the lack of snow experienced in many areas of the State during December 1988 and January 1989. The money would be deposited in the Natural Disaster Business Assistance Fund administered by the Finance Authority of Maine. In order to be eligible for loan funds, businesses would have to demonstrate that they have been injured due to lack of snow, that they have insufficient access to other sources of financing, that they have repayment ability and that the loan will assist them in recovering from the effects of the snow drought. The bill would declare the snow drought to be a natural disaster for purposes of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 10, chapter 110, subchapter I-C only.
