#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §4561, as amended by PL 1987, c. 709, §1, is further amended to read:

#### §4561. Members

The Maine Human Rights Commission, established by section 9 12004 12004-G, subsection 8 15, shall be an independent commission of no more than 5 members. No more than 3 of the 11 members shall be of the same political party. The members shall be appointed by the Governor, subject to review by the joint 13 standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over judiciary and confirmation by the Legislature. The Governor 15 shall designate one member to be the chair.
