An Act to Require Government Agencies to Notify the Public and Local Officials of Potential Public Land Purchases.

Comment of the comment

1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

12 MRSA §561 is enacted to read:

§561. Notification before land acquisition

Whenever the State or any state department or agency considers the acquisition, by whatever means, of particular land or lands within any locality, the State or that state department or agency shall notify the director in writing. The director or the director's designee shall notify the public and all members of any local legislative body of the State's or any state department's or agency's consideration of local land for acquisition. The notification to the public shall be by publication of a notice in a newspaper of general circulation in that area. Notification to members of the local legislative body shall be by first-class mail.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires the Director of the Bureau of Public Lands to notify the public and the local legislative body of the State's consideration of land acquisition in that locality. The bureau must publish its intentions in a local newspaper and send a letter to each member of the local legislative body before the State may acquire land.
