assume responsibility for coastal search and rescue and to enhance its capacity for enforcement of boating laws. A companion bill is being submitted to give the department the responsibility for search and rescue.

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Funding for personnel and vehicles is to come from the General Fund. To the extent this is not possible, the study committee recommends that funds shall come from an increase in the sales tax on boats.

The majority of the funding for the required 3 additional boats for the department is to come from increases in boat registration fees. In the first year, however, since the increase in fees will not be in effect the entire year, some boat funding will have to come from the General Fund.
