An Act Related to State Preemption of Firearms Regulation.



1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	25 MRSA c. 252-A is enacted to read:
5	CHAPTER 252-A
7	FIREARM REGULATION
. 9	§2011. Legislative presumption
11	1. Presumption. The Legislature occupies and preempts the entire field of legislation touching in any way firearms,
13	components, ammunition and supplies to the complete exclusion of any order, ordinance, rule or regulation by any political
15	subdivision of this State. Any existing or future orders, ordinances, rules or regulations in this field are void except as
17	provided in subsection 3.
19	2. Regulation restricted. No county, city, town, village, municipality or other political subdivision of this State, may
21	adopt any order, ordinance, rule or regulation concerning in any way the sale, purchase, purchase delay, transfer, ownership, use,
23	possession, bearing, transportation, licensing, permit, registration, taxation other than sales and compensating use
25	taxes or other controls of firearms, components, ammunition and supplies except as provided in subsection 3.
27	3. Exception. Nothing contained in this section may
29	prohibit any ordinance of any political subdivision which conforms exactly with any of the provisions of chapter 252 or
31	Title 17-A, with appropriate penalty provisions or which regulates the discharge of firearms within a jurisdiction.
