COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A" to S.P. 371, L.D. 995, Bill, "An Act to Fund and Implement Changes in Health Insurance Benefits in Collective Bargaining Agreements with Maine Maritime Academy Employees Represented by the Maine State Employees Association"

Amend the bill by striking out all of the appropriation (page 1, lines 18 to 41 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

'Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

Provides funds for the next biennium to pay for dependent coverage for health insurance as provided in collective bargaining agreements.'

Further amend the bill by inserting after the emergency clause and before the statement of fact the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

The Maine Maritime Academy will be able to implement the payment of the dependent health insurance coverage for fiscal year 1988-89 within its existing budgeted resources.'
