STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Fund and Implement Changes in Health Insurance Benefits in Collective Bargaining Agreements with Maine Maritime Academy Employees Represented by the Maine State Employees Association.

(EMERGENCY)

1 ... Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the funding necessary to fulfill the collective 5 bargaining agreements with employees of the Maine Maritime Academy must be provided prior to the end of fiscal year 1988-89; 7 and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts 11 create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 13 safety; now, therefore, 15

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the 19 General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

- 29 Provides funds for the remainder of this biennium to pay for dependent 31 health coverage for insurance as provided in 33 collective bargaining agreements and provides 35 funds for thenext 37 biennium to pay for dependent coverage for 39 health insurance as provided in collective bargaining agreements. 41
 - Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

49 Employees of the Maine Maritime Academy have recently formed bargaining units and have negotiated their first collective 51 bargaining agreements. Funding is needed to implement the health
