23	Further amend the bill by inserting at the beginning of the first line after the enacting clause (page 1, line 3 in L.D.) the
25	following: 'Sec. 1.'
27	Further amend the bill by inserting before the statement of fact the following:
29	'Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §15602, sub-§4 is enacted to read:
31	4. Minimum subsidy for unorganized territories. It is the
33	intent of the Legislature to include the unorganized territories in any provision enacted in the future which requires payment of
35	a minimum subsidy to each school administrative unit. For purposes of this subsection, minimum subsidy means the subsidy
37	provided in section 15613, subsection 13, and other similar state subsidies to education paid on a percentage basis. Any minimum
39	subsidy shall be calculated as if the unorganized territories were a school administrative unit.

9	territories. This bill will also increase the General Fund appropriation necessary to fund any future increases in minimum
11	state subsidies.'

	STATEMENT OF FACT

	The amendment changes the title of the bill to more
17	accurately reflect the bill's contents, adds an appropriation section and adds a fiscal note to include the unorganized
19	territories in future minimum subsidy legislation.
