**An Act to Include Unorganized Territories as School Administrative
Units.**



1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

3 **20-A MRSA §15613, sub-§13, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 848,**
5 **§10, is amended to read:**

7 13. **Minimum state allocation.** Effective 1988-89, each
9 school administrative unit, including those units located in
11 unorganized territories, shall be guaranteed a minimum state
13 share of its total allocation that is determined by multiplying
15 5% of the foundation per pupil operating rate by the average
17 number of resident kindergarten to grade 12 pupils, including
special education tuition pupils, in the unit on April 1st and
October 1st of the calendar year immediately prior to the year of
allocation. These funds shall be included as part of the school
unit's total allocation as computed under this chapter and not as
an adjustment to the unit's total allocation.

19 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

21 This bill includes unorganized territories in the minimum
state allocation under the school funding formula.
