An Act to Establish a Reporting Mechanism for Legislators Attending Educational Conferences.

9	and 168 whose attendance at a conference, seminar or similar informational meeting is funded in whole or in part by state

7	STATEMENT OF FACT
9	
11 13	The purpose of this bill is to provide the Legislature and state taxpayers with a summary of information derived by Legislators and legislative staff persons who attend conferences and seminars at state expense.
1 -	
15	This bill requires each Legislator and legislative staff person whose attendance at a conference, seminar or other similar
17	informational meeting is funded in whole or in part by state money to file a report with the Executive Director of the
19	Legislative Council within 30 days following the end of the conference. This report will contain the following information:
21	
23	 The date, location and sponsor of the conference;
25	The subject matters or issues presented at workshops which the Legislator or staff person attended;
27	 The purpose for the Legislator's or legislative staff person's attendance at the conference;
29	
31	 The names and areas of expertise of the speakers and presenters at the conference; and
33	5. A summary of the information presented at the conference.
35	The reports will be compiled by the Executive Director of
37	the Legislative Council who will arrange and index them by subject matter. The annual publication will contain the reports for the preceding calendar year.

41	In the event that a Legislator or legislative staff person fails to file a report as required, the Legislator or staff person will pay the costs for attendance at the conference. Upon
43	submission of the report as required, the bill of charges to the Legislator or legislative staff person will be cancelled.

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
